"The Huang Clan isn't far. Let our two clans coexist peacefully during this time," Adams suggested, cringing at himself for uttering what felt like empty words.


"Alright," Gu Chaoyan agreed, appreciating the idea of peace.

"Don't be a nuisance in my presence, or I can't guarantee I won't take further action."


"I didn't permit you to join the journey to the Huang Clan to cause trouble for my Five Elements Clan."
