Chapter 391: Migration

Just like the hides of demonic beasts, one can create more blank paper talismans. The talismans made from the hides of Third Rank demonic beasts can even be used to refine Third Rank talismans.

Although Taiyi Sect currently lacks a Third Rank Talisman Master, this precious strategic resource will be carefully stored and won't be wasted.

With Yang Xueyi's talent, if she accepts the inheritance of the Purple Gold Sect's Third Rank Talisman Master, it is highly likely that she will grow into a Third Rank Talisman Master in the future.

Under Yang Xueyi's leadership, the Talisman Hall has produced many excellent Talisman Masters. With these high-quality talisman papers, more talismans can be crafted.

As a Second Rank Talisman Master, Yang Xueyi's Second Rank talismans are highly sought after even by Foundation Building stage cultivators.

Within the sect, they are quickly snatched up by Foundation Building cultivators, and occasionally a few of them are sold at high prices outside.

Countless demonic beast blood and flesh have allowed Taiyi Sect's Dining Hall to produce a large variety of spiritual dishes.

Compared to medicinal pills, the effects of consuming spiritual dishes are better and have fewer side effects.

Previously, Taiyi Sect acquired a recipe for brewing spirit wine from the Hidden Scripture Pavilion at Forest Spring Watch. It requires a large amount of fresh demonic beast blood as a material.

The higher the rank of the demonic beast, the better the effect of the brewed spirit wine.

In the past, Forest Spring Watch mostly used First Rank demonic beast blood to brew their wine.

The spirit wine produced is in high demand on the market.

Now, Taiyi Sect has used secret methods to preserve a vast amount of fresh demonic beast blood and meat. Not only First Rank but even Second Rank and Third Rank demonic beast blood is abundant.

After a long time without brewing spirit wine personally, Yang Xueyi couldn't resist and made a considerable amount of precious spirit wine.

Various materials like claws and fangs from demonic beasts have piled up in the Tool Refinery's warehouse, keeping the sect's tool refiners extremely busy.

With Taiyi Sect's current number of tool refiners, even if they spend decades, it's uncertain they can refine all these materials into magic tools.

In short, this failed invasion by the demonic beast army has left a mountain of demonic beast corpses, which has allowed Taiyi Sect to accumulate a massive amount of materials that can sustain the entire sect for many years.

Seeing that the Flying Swan Sect has shown no interest in the former Earthfire Sect's territory and hasn't troubled Taiyi Sect, Meng Zhang and the elders silently moved Taiyi Sect's mountain gate to the original location of Earthfire Sect's mountain gate.

The original Taiyi Sect's mountain gate, Fuzhao Valley, like the old mountain gate, became an important branch base of Taiyi Sect.

Within Earthfire Sect's mountain gate lies a rare Second Rank high-grade spirit vein, providing abundant spiritual energy and excellent surroundings.

Since the cultivators inside the mountain gate surrendered willingly, the various buildings within the mountain gate remained mostly intact.

The spirit medicine garden and spirit fields, among other things, go without saying. The tool refining rooms established by the former Earthfire Sect cultivators are especially precious.

Those former Earthfire Sect cultivators risked much to venture deep into the underground, pulling the ground fire to the surface and using secret methods to control it as a tool refining fire.

Earthfire Sect's tool refining rooms may not be the best in the entire Endless Sea of Sand, but they are at least among the top three.

Apart from Flying Swan Sect and Firewell Market, there are no other places that can boast better tool refining rooms.

Firewell Market originally belonged to Earthfire Sect and is now under Taiyi Sect's control.

After Taiyi Sect gained control of Firewell Market, they adopted the same approach as with Earthfire Sect.

They opened the tool refining rooms in Firewell Market to all cultivators in the Endless Sea of Sand. Anyone who can afford the rent, regardless of their identity, can lease them.

This approach not only brings in a large income for the sect but also attracts many tool refiners to Firewell Market. Thanks to this, Firewell Market has become a renowned tool refining center in the Endless Sea of Sand.

When multiple tool refiners work inside Firewell Market, flames soar into the sky, and thick smoke obscures the sun. Such a spectacular scene cannot even be seen in Flying Swan City.

Meng Zhang, not wanting to draw the attention of the Flying Swan Sect, quietly completed the relocation of Taiyi Sect's mountain gate.

Even the joy of moving was not celebrated grandly.

In reality, Taiyi Sect's control over such a large area, maintaining its peace, has unknowingly affected Flying Swan Sect.

Many people in Flying Swan City personally witnessed when Fire Cloud Sect's Gold Core Daoist Master destroyed the Flying Swan Sect's mountain gate, which was close by.

Later, the battle between the six Gold Core Daoist Masters, though Fei Shi Daoist Master tried to stop it, still caused significant damage to the nearby Flying Swan City.

The battles among Primordial Spirit True Monarchs are said to cause scenes of sky and earth tearing apart, known as the "Disaster of Heaven's Tilt," one of the most terrifying natural disasters in the Cultivation World.

Though not as fearsome as the battles of Gold Core Daoist Masters, it still has a great impact on the surrounding areas.

Apart from the Flying Swan Sect cultivators and affiliated families' cultivators, Flying Swan City also houses many outsiders, loose cultivators, various Shang Families, and other small cultivation forces from different places.

These cultivators, not closely related to Flying Swan Sect, naturally didn't want to continue staying here and facing risks.

The last Gold Core battle caused significant damage to the city and claimed the lives of many unfortunate individuals.

If it were to happen again, the entire city might be destroyed.

Flying Swan City sits atop a Second Rank high-grade spirit vein, but its city protection great formation is only Second Rank, unable to withstand rampaging Gold Core Daoist Masters.

As a result, many capable cultivators have moved away, leaving this increasingly unsafe city.

In the Endless Sea of Sand, besides Flying Swan City, Taiyi Sect's territory, especially Firewell Market and Singing Sand City, is the safest.

Though Taiyi Sect experienced the invasion of the demonic beast army, their cultivators successfully defeated the beasts and prevented them from wreaking havoc within their territory.

At least for now, Taiyi Sect's territory remains relatively safe, a place where one can temporarily find refuge. At the very least, there are no large-scale battles among Gold Core Daoist Masters here.

The gradual outflow of cultivators from Flying Swan Sect to Taiyi Sect has started. Flying Swan City is gradually becoming desolate, while Taiyi Sect's territory is prospering.

As for why these cultivators do not move to safer territories under Jiuqu League, such as Great Wind City, the reason is simple. Flying Swan City is a small town compared to Great Wind City, which is a large city.

Not everyone in the small town has the qualifications to live in the city of An Family.

Living in a big city is not easy, and it's challenging to make a living there.

On the other hand, Taiyi Sect's territory in the Endless Sea of Sand is more suitable for these cultivators in terms of environment and other factors.

Of course, the migration of cultivators from Flying Swan City to Taiyi Sect is a slow process, and it has not yet attracted the attention of the Flying Swan Sect's high-ranking members, who are currently busy with other matters.

After the demon army was repelled by the Flying Swan Sect and retreated to the Demon Wind Gobi, they didn't launch another large-scale attack. However, during this time, small groups of demons began assaulting the outposts near the Demon Wind Gobi, close to the Flying Swan Sect.

The Flying Swan Sect had to increase their patrol efforts and sent out teams day and night to guard the border with the Demon Wind Gobi, preventing surprise attacks from the demons.

Upon his return to the Fire Cloud Sect, Daoist Master Scarlet Flame told the cultivators about the events that happened to the Fire Cloud Sect cultivator army and assured them that it wouldn't happen again. There wouldn't be any mysterious Gold Core Daoist Masters coming to help the Flying Swan Sect this time.

So, the three Gold Core Daoist Masters of the Fire Cloud Sect once again led their cultivator army and headed towards the Endless Sea of Sand.

The Fire Cloud Sect cultivator army didn't hide its tracks but marched openly towards the Endless Sea of Sand. However, upon entering the Endless Sea of Sand, they were confronted by a large force led by the Flying Swan Sect's Daoist Master Fei Shi and two Gold Core Daoist Masters from the Northern Desert Qi Family, blocking their path.

Although there were no large-scale battles, small conflicts and covert actions, such as infiltration and assassination attempts between small groups of cultivators, occurred continuously, resulting in significant casualties for both sides.

Neither side wanted to initiate an all-out war and preferred to maintain the current situation. The Fire Cloud Sect awaited the opportunity for the Demon Wind Gobi's demon army to attack first. On the other hand, the Flying Swan Sect and the Northern Desert Qi Family were not confident in defeating the Fire Cloud Sect cultivator army before them. They could only silently wait and find ways to delay time until new variables emerged.

Fei Jiang, the Daoist Master of the Flying Swan Sect, also needed ample time to heal his injuries and recover his cultivation base.

Regarding the Demon Wind Gobi's demon army, it was unlikely that they would launch another large-scale invasion. At most, there might be minor harassments from a few demons. Therefore, there was no great need to summon cultivators from all the forces in the Endless Sea of Sand as they had done before.

Summoning cultivators from various forces involved considerable effort and costs for the Flying Swan Sect. Furthermore, it required providing various supplies and rewards for their assistance during the battles.

Handling the pressure from both the Fire Cloud Sect and the Demon Wind Gobi's demon army, the Flying Swan Sect could only focus primarily on appearing the other cultivation forces in the Endless Sea of Sand.

As for the Taiyi Sect, this situation provided them with a golden period of development. The Firewell Market and Singing Sand City within Taiyi Sect's territory became increasingly prosperous, attracting a large number of people and flourishing businesses, bringing tremendous benefits to the Taiyi Sect. Even after allocating some benefits to the Qiaoshou Sect, Taiyi Sect still made substantial profits.

Taiyi Sect grew stronger day by day, with a rising number of disciples apart from Niu Dawei, the Foundation Building cultivator.

In contrast, the Qiaoshou Sect suffered losses in the previous battle, losing two Foundation Building cultivators, including Aunt Jin, who was a mainstay of the sect. This widened the gap in strength between Qiaoshou Sect and Taiyi Sect. When facing Taiyi Sect, Qiaoshou Sect couldn't stand firm.

Though Qiaoshou Sect was not entirely subservient to Taiyi Sect, in most matters, they looked up to Taiyi Sect as their leader.

With the full support of Qiaoshou Sect, Meng Zhang's confidence in consolidating the surrounding cultivation forces grew stronger.

Recent good fortune smiled upon Taiyi Sect, not limited to just one incident. After a prolonged seclusion, Shi Changqing successfully expelled the pill toxin from his body and emerged from seclusion, finally recovering from his injuries.

Meng Zhang had carefully preserved the Third Rank demon pill from the Giant Lizard Demon General and gathered all the necessary auxiliary medicinal materials. Among the two commonly used recipes for Foundation Building Pills, the one that utilized a Third Rank demon pill as the main ingredient required relatively lower-grade auxiliary herbs.

Once Shi Changqing adjusted his state, he immediately started the alchemy process. This time, luck was on his side as he successfully refined a pill furnace and remarkably increased the success rate compared to the last time. He managed to produce five Foundation Building Pills.

Following his promise, Meng Zhang distributed two Foundation Building Pills to the Qiaoshou Sect as compensation. Without Aunt Jin's sacrifice and Jin Qiao'er's Yin Thunder, it would have been difficult to kill the Giant Lizard Demon General on the spot.

After the battle, apart from the Third Rank demon pill, most of the Giant Lizard's remains fell into Taivi Sect's hands. Meng Zhang was fair when dealing with allies.

Additionally, he rewarded Shi Changqing with a Foundation Building Pill as payment for his hard work. The final two Foundation Building Pills were placed in Taiyi Sect's treasury.

Feeling that his condition was optimal, Shi Changqing decided to strike while the iron was hot and continue refining Lesser Foundation Building Pills.

The medicinal materials for Lesser Foundation Building Pills had been collected long ago, and Shi Changqing was fully prepared to start the alchemy process.

Learning from the previous experience, Shi Changqing successfully refined the Lesser Foundation Building Pills this time. However, the success rate was not very high, and he obtained only four pills. Moreover, during the alchemy process, Shi Changqing was once again contaminated by the pill toxin. Though the situation was not as severe as last time, it still required some time to expel the pill toxin.

The difficulty of refining Lesser Foundation Building Pills wasn't necessarily lower than that of Foundation Building Pills, and it was unavoidable to be contaminated by the pill toxin during the process. Without sufficient incentive, many Second Rank Alchemists would probably be unwilling to refine this type of pill.

Chapter 393: Completion of the Foundation Building

Although the Shi Family is a vassal of the Taiyi Sect, Meng Zhang cannot simply order Shi Changqing around. According to the customs of the Cultivation World, the Alchemist must be rewarded.

This time, after refining four Lesser Foundation Building Pills, one of them was set aside as Shi Changqing's reward. Shi Changqing is an honest person and has not engaged in any deceitful actions, such as withholding finished pills or greedily hoarding alchemical materials. He only takes what he rightfully deserves as his reward and would never overindulge or misuse his identity as an Alchemist.

In reality, the reward Meng Zhang gave Shi Changqing wasn't high. Out of consideration for Shi Family's status as the main family within the Taiyi Sect, Meng Zhang only charged him a token price of three Lesser Foundation Building Pills, which he also released into the sect's treasury.

The flaws of the Lesser Foundation Building Pills are not a secret within the Taiyi Sect. Once Meng Zhang learned of them, he proactively disclosed the information to the disciples within the sect. As a result, he established a rule that only cultivators with low-grade spiritual roots could freely exchange for the Lesser Foundation Building Pills. Given their qualifications, the chances of them successfully reaching the Gold Core stage were exceedingly slim.

For those with middle-grade spiritual roots who completed Refining Qi cultivation, they were granted priority to exchange for the true Foundation Building Pills. The ingredients needed to refine these pills were difficult to collect, despite Meng Zhang's best efforts to gather them. Consequently, these two Foundation Building Pills held significant importance to him.

It was uncertain when the Taiyi Sect would acquire more Foundation Building Pills. As for the Lesser Foundation Building Pills, Meng Zhang was more lenient. If Shi Changqing successfully

refined alchemy next time, he could distribute them to affiliated families or even sell them in exchange for other spiritual items.

Speaking of affiliated families, as the prestige of the Taiyi Sect grew with each passing year, an increasing number of small clans sought to become affiliated with the sect. Given the vast territory under Taiyi Sect's control, managing it solely with the sect's own power was impossible. To address this, Meng Zhang allocated some remote or less valuable territories to these small families. As a result, seven or eight small clans became affiliated with the Taiyi Sect in a short period.

Furthermore, the Co-operative Society that Meng Zhang established back then had grown and developed over time. Some outstanding disciples within the Co-operative Society earned the opportunity to join the Taiyi Sect. Several cultivators from the Co-operative Society who had performed well during the previous expedition alongside the Taiyi Sect's army caught Meng Zhang's attention. They not only successfully entered the Taiyi Sect but were also given special attention by Meng Zhang.

Amidst handling various sect matters, Meng Zhang didn't forget to continue refining the Sunstone and Moonjade Liquid. Although he only obtained some scraps from the Earthfire Sect's treasury, the refinement process was still extremely challenging. Fortunately, the cultivation method he practiced, the "Sun-Moon Wheel Turning Sutra," possessed some unique techniques for refining both the sun and moon attribute spiritual items.

Seven years after defeating the army of monsters, Meng Zhang had finally completed the refinement of two Heaven and Earth Spiritual Objects, and his Cultivation Base successfully reached the Foundation Building completion stage. Now, in the entire Endless Sea of Sand, besides a few Gold Core Daoist Masters, Meng Zhang was practically invincible.

His next step was to strive for a breakthrough to the Gold Core stage and become a Gold Core Daoist Master. For all cultivators at the Foundation Building completion stage, breaking through to the Gold Core stage was an extremely difficult task. Even those so-called Gold Core seeds carefully cultivated by major sects couldn't guarantee a hundred percent success in forming the core.

Meng Zhang, possessing top-grade spiritual roots and exceptional character, was also uncertain of his success in Foundation Building. Overcoming the difficulties to reach the Gold Core stage was a daunting task for him.

Putting aside the preparations he had made, just considering the external requirements, Foundation Building cultivators attempting to break through to Gold Core usually needed to do so above a Third Rank spirit vein. After forming the core, they still required a Third Rank spirit vein to help stabilize their Cultivation Base.

Meng Zhang had no interest in using unconventional methods to achieve this breakthrough and lacked the rare Heaven and Earth Spiritual Objects needed. For him, the safest approach was to break through honestly on a Third Rank spirit vein.

Most of the Third Rank spirit veins in the Endless Sea of Sand were controlled by the Flying Swan Sect. Perhaps the Northern Desert Qi Family also had one. However, Meng Zhang couldn't trust either of them.

He was aware of the methods Flying Swan Sect used to deal with those attempting to break through to the Gold Core stage in the Endless Sea of Sand. Even though Taiyi Sect's relationship with Flying

Swan Sect was amicable, Meng Zhang couldn't risk revealing his intention to break through to the Gold Core stage to them.

As for the records of previous Sect Masters' experiences that Meng Zhang possessed in the Sect Master's chronicle, it had been compiled after Taiyi Sect's reconstruction and only covered the Gold Core stage or lower. There was little detailed information about breaking through to the Gold Core stage or the cultivation after that.

Fortunately, the "Sun-Moon Wheel Turning Sutra" that Meng Zhang cultivated was relatively complete. It included content about cultivation after the Gold Core stage and provided some insights on breaking through to Gold Core. However, this alone was far from enough to ensure a successful breakthrough.

Meng Zhang still needed to make various preparations after reaching the Foundation Building completion stage. He carefully studied various scriptures in the Hidden Scripture Pavilion, enriching his knowledge and drawing from their merits.

Chapter 394: Pill Master Guild

Meng Zhang spent a considerable amount of time reciting the scriptures and comprehending the Dao teachings. In the eyes of most cultivators in the Cultivation World, these scriptures that couldn't directly enhance one's Cultivation Base were considered useless decorations. However, as Meng Zhang's comprehension deepened, he gained more and more benefits from these scriptures. He felt his Dao heart becoming increasingly clear and tranquil, experiencing a peace he had never known before.

The Dao heart was intangible, and many cultivators might appear resolute on the surface, but when faced with critical moments or significant changes, their Dao hearts would waver, and their minds would be in turmoil. However, after years of comprehending the Dao teachings, Meng Zhang could sense the issues within his own Dao heart and make targeted adjustments to remedy them.

With his Dao heart becoming purer, Meng Zhang became more composed when using the Grand Evolving Fortune. He no longer needed to spend significant amounts of time calming his mind and focusing before casting the Calculated spells, as he used to do. The rewards he gained from studying the Dao teachings also directly influenced his Heavenly Mechanism Technique.

His cultivation of the Grand Evolving Fortune made significant progress, reaching a new level. He went from merely scratching the surface and gaining some insights to achieving substantial accomplishments and fully grasping the technique.

Previously, every time Meng Zhang used the Grand Evolving Fortune, he needed to consume calculation tallies. He had to spend a lot of time meditating daily to accumulate enough tallies for the spells. Additionally, more complex Calculated spells required a large number of calculation tallies, often depleting the ones he had accumulated over several years after only a few uses.

Now, all the previously accumulated calculation tallies had vanished, replaced by a new, more durable type of calculation tally. One of these new calculation tallies was almost equivalent to 50-60

However, she was preparing to break through to Foundation Building soon, as her cultivation had already reached the Refining Qi completion stage, and Taiyi Sect had an ample supply of Foundation Building Pills and Lesser Foundation Building Pills.

Now that the time was ripe for establishing the Pill Master Guild, Meng Zhang immediately set the plan in motion. He entrusted Niu Dawei to oversee the matter, not only to train him but also to help him gain prestige. Due to the sufficient preparation beforehand, the difficulties they encountered were minimal, and everything was completed effortlessly.

The newly established Pill Master Guild was led by Taiyi Sect and included other cultivation forces such as Qiaoshou Sect and Land Walk Sect in the surrounding area. In the future, members of the guild would have priority in acquiring spirit medicines that could be used for alchemy within the surrounding region. Other supplementary spiritual materials and pills might be dispensable, but a Third Rank Spirit Vein was absolutely essential.

Chapter 395: Choice

Actually, Deep EarthSpirit General had mentioned to Meng Zhang before that as a Geomancer, he had a way to cultivate a Third Rank spirit vein. One method is to select a high-quality Second Rank spirit vein, invest a considerable amount of time, and consume numerous precious spiritual materials to slowly nurture it, waiting for the spirit vein to naturally advance. However, this approach takes too long, and it's unlikely to yield significant results within a hundred years.

To shorten the time required, one needs to utilize some rare heavenly materials. For instance, the spiritual source pearl they obtained in the sand monster's lair is a treasure that can rapidly enhance the quality of a spirit vein. Unfortunately, Meng Zhang neither has enough time to wait nor possesses such a rare treasure as the spiritual source pearl. Therefore, this cultivation method seems impractical for now.

The second method involves employing a secret technique to extract essence from multiple spirit veins and forcibly condensing it into a Third Rank spirit vein. Not to mention the tremendous waste and destruction caused by this approach, it also requires at least a Third Rank Geomancer to execute. However, becoming a Third Rank Geomancer requires a Cultivation Base of at least Gold Core level.

For the Deep EarthSpirit General in his prime, this might not have been an issue. But now, even if he used to be powerful, he only possesses a Cultivation Base at the Foundation Building level, and the prospect of restoring his former glory seems remote. After falling to the Foundation Building

level, the former Third Rank Geomancer can no longer execute the techniques of a Third Rank Geomancer and is left with theoretical knowledge.

Both methods proposed by Deep EarthSpirit General are not useful. If Meng Zhang wants to break through to the Gold Core level, it would be better to find an existing Third Rank spirit vein. If he can't find one within the Endless Sea of Sand, then he must look beyond its borders.

For the sake of his goal to form the core, Meng Zhang decides to leave the Endless Sea of Sand and embark on a journey. Before departing, he arranges all the sect's affairs.

On a regular day, the sect's daily operations are managed by various departments. Whether Flying Swan Sect would welcome Meng Zhang forming the core is uncertain. He is not willing to leave his fate and future in the hands of others.

When Meng Zhang departs from Taiyi Sect, the public statement given by Taiyi Sect to the outside world is that Sect Master Meng Zhang received an invitation from a cultivator of the Gu Yue Family in Great Wind City to attend a dharma meeting and exchange ideas with Gu Yue Family's cultivators.

Meng Zhang's first destination after leaving the Endless Sea of Sand is Great Wind City. He takes a Second Rank flying ship of Taiyi Sect and arrives smoothly in Great Wind City.

He visits Gu Yue Youlan, a fellow disciple from Taiyi Sect, and explains his purposeto request the use of Gu Yue Family's Third Rank spirit vein for secluded cultivation to form the core.

Gu Yue Youlan cannot make such a significant decision and asks Meng Zhang to wait for Gu Yue Huaidie, who will have the final say.

Meng Zhang can choose a suitable female cultivator from Gu Yue Family, and there is no need for him to give up his surname.

Despite Gu Yue Huaidie's high regard and kindness, Meng Zhang isn't entirely satisfied with the two choices and is reluctant to accept either of them.

you here, to make use of the Primordial Spirit True Monarch's domain," Jue Ying said, taking out a jade pendant identical to Meng Zhang's.

"Although there seem to be no strong figures in the Endless Sea of Sand, the entire region is under the scrutiny of several Primordial Spirit True Monarchs."
