Everett appeared very angry. He took a seat and instructed his men to release Emily.


However, after listening to Everett, Emily was too apprehensive and shocked to leave.

The children intentionally created some noise when Arielle answered the phone.


Luckily, the children's mouths were sealed shut, or else they would have spoiled Arielle's plan.
