Fourth ball — AB takes a single, quick as lightning between the wickets. Aarav back on strike.

Fifth ball — Aarav defends solidly. Bat face straight.

Ravi Shastri (Voice Rising): Last ball of the over... Krunal floats one short... Aarav rocks back, transfers the weight... AND PULLS IT! SIX RUNS! WHAT A SHOT! Controlled, clean, crisp!
