The ball whizzed across the six-yard box well out of reach from the keeper but none of the nearby forwards can get close to it.

Luckily for Celtic who also missed the chance to clear it on its way through. Gasps of relief and groans of disappointment instantly descended from the sands. Brendon Rodgers especially heaved a sigh of relief as he felt his heart rate calm down again.
