Since the wager requirement was so low, Chen Mo naturally chose to bet without hesitation.

[The Heavenly Path's Hint: Wager complete. Matching participants. Please choose whether to specify a particular Star System. Doing so will require a double wager, but rewards will remain at the single-fold rate unless your matched opponent also chose a specified matchup.]

So we can specify, interesting.

A double wager was nothing to him. Chen Mo directly specified the Yongming Star System.

[The Heavenly Path's Hint: Specified matchup selection complete. Matching opponents for you, which will include an opponent from the Yongming Star System. Matching duration is one minute. If no opponent is found within the time limit, you may try changing the specified Star System and rematching.]

Less than ten seconds after The Heavenly Path's Hint concluded, it sounded again.

[The Heavenly Path's Hint: Matching complete. The three Star Systems matched this time are the Solar System, the Yongming Star System, and the Sanyang System.]

Solar System: 1 participant, average Level 30.

Yongming Star System: 5 participants, average Level 40.

Sanyang System: 5 participants, average Level 40.

The Solar System participant used the specified Star System matching, so their wager is doubled.]

As The Heavenly Path's Hint ended, the five participants from the Yongming Star System were somewhat stunned.

When they were matched with the Solar System, they initially thought it was quite a coincidence. There are many Intragalactic Systems within the Milky Way; both the Solar System and the Yongming Star System are just two tiny specks among them. They hadn't expected such a coincidental match.

It turned out the participant from the Solar System had used the specify function.
