Reviving heroes requires paying a fee, which increases with the hero level. However, if you have emergency medical talents, you can revive Vice Heroes after battle. Heroes revived through emergency care will be in a weakened state for a long period.

— Beginner Tip: A ship is equivalent to moving territory, with sailing mode akin to territory management mode; a Captain can assign various duties to the Vice Hero, who can apply their talents in different positions. It is recommended to appoint your first Vice Hero as the First Officer.

— First Officer: Deputy Captain, possessing all the captain's functions, able to cruise automatically when the captain is absent.

Natural Specialty: Noble Demeanor (A noble demeanor makes one appear distinguished and refined, easily gaining recognition from high society as well as the respect of the common people)

Professional Specialties: Master of Treasure Identification (An advanced form of the Pirate's professional specialty "Treasure Intuition," pirates have an extraordinary intuition for discovering treasure, and Catherine excels even among them)

Command Power: 36

Attack: 60 (50 Strategic Attack, Weapon +10 Personal Attack)

Defense: 30 (0 Strategic Defense, Armor +30 Personal Defense)

Magic Power: 0

Knowledge: 0

Health: 70

Attack Speed: 22 (Weapon +2 Attack Speed)

Move Speed: 14

Melee Damage: 17-22

Ranged Damage: 4-8

Personal Skills: Dual-Wielding, Fire Gun Shooting, Agile Evasion, War Plunder, Threatening Intimidation.
(Activating these active skills will consume additional Stamina)

Hero Skills: Master-level Navigation Skill, Master-level Attack Skill, Intermediate Leadership Skill

Current Equipment: Crimson Dual Blades, Pirate Full Set of Leather Armor

——Crimson Dual Blades: Personal Attack +10, Damage +4, Attack Speed +2.

——Dwarf Short-Handle Fire Gun: Personal Attack +10, Damage 4-8.

——Pirate Full Set of Leather Armor: Personal Defense +30.

Possessed Treasure: Precision Craftsman's Telescope.

Hero Skills: Master-level Navigation Skill, Master-level Attack Skill, Intermediate Leadership Skill

Isn't she supposed to be a pirate? Then why does she have the natural specialty of Noble Demeanor? And why would a pirate have a professional specialty like Master of Treasure Identification? That's just too artsy, isn't it?

It means holding two blades at once, which means her Attack Speed is twice as fast as normal people. Hence, this extraordinarily high 22-point Attack Speed isn't unfounded.

But man, I'm so cool, just played for three days and got myself an Epic Hero. When other people's Mages get into shape, mine has already left them blocks behind, who's afraid of who? Nevertheless, low Defense is ultimately a big problem, so as the main hero, I need to plan my attribute points carefully.

Now the issue is her innate Professional Specialties.

Noble temperament is neither a combat specialty I urgently need nor a management specialty, but a pirate with culture is frightening, and the existence of an Epic Hero has its rationale, just depends on how the player utilizes it.

Catherine responded coquettishly: “How annoying~”

So annoying~~! I’m about to melt here! Am I sure I’m playing a game? Why don’t real women ever make me feel this way, isn’t this true love? Wahahaha!

(Note: Players' armies cannot enter cities)

And Vice Heroes' roles are, of course, not limited to just accompanying players in battles. They can also lead troops independently, complete tasks on behalf of the player, or act as Deputy City Lords managing castles. Especially for players who own castles, the ability of a Vice Hero City Lord is critical to whether the player can have a good night's sleep while offline.

Ships are often referred to as "moving territories," akin to mobile castles. After Da Fei appointed Catherine as the First Officer, she could independently engage in trade even when Da Fei was not on the ship or even offline. (Doesn't it sound like an offline gold-farming bot?) But if Catherine's identity were that of a Pirate Hero, that might be a problem. Kingdom Navy might overlook it because the owner is Da

Fei, or they might attack on sight, and even the port may not allow Catherine to dock. To put it simply, anything could happen.

So, if players don't want a headache, they should, in principle, hire heroes from the same faction. Unless they encounter an enemy faction hero who is exceptionally valuable.

Now, what's with Catherine's situation? Dual identity! She can play all sides! This alone significantly increases the safety of her independent trading voyages. Probably, the benefits don't stop there. As a pirate, she can dispose of loot and trade on pirate territory, meaning I could open up an entire pirate market!

Da Fei realized where the value of her special skill lies—this is definitely the high society route. Those brawling combat specialties pale in comparison to her!

However high-end the high society route may be, it still needs a solid foundation from the lower route. I still need to recruit capable heroes to strengthen the team, to compensate for the pirate's lack of Blood Defense and to form a Mysterious Stealth Navigation team. The next step is to recruit a Magic Type hero, preferably a beauty.

Speaking of beautiful Magic Heroes, Da Fei suddenly remembered the 15-year-old daughter mentioned in the Sailing Captain's diary. She must have been placed in the church, right? Could she have learned Light Magic? Could she be a hero? Da Fei was filled with anticipation.

Heroes with professional specialty specialization are assuredly good heroes.

Although Hell Gate Master is a professional specialty specialization, it's categorized under innate talents; in other words, such a talent is available from the player's initial creation, lottery draws, and before any job changes. Similarly, the 'Knight Model' hero, valued at \$3 million, also has an advanced form of the common Knight Priest professional specialty 'Blessing Ceremony,' another professional specialty specialization, again classified under innate talents.

This setup implies that a hero is destined for their role from birth.

What does this imply? Normally, Catherine's Master of Treasure Identification should be under innate talents as well. But now, this talent is in her professional specialties.

Isn't this exactly the effect of my Navigator God-level Scroll? Transforming an innate talent into a professional specialty, then creating a new spot for an innate talent; this signifies that Catherine is actually a dual-specialty hero!

—System Prompt: Congratulations! You have used 1 Skill Point to acquire the Navigator professional specialty ‘Storm Navigation.’

—Storm Navigation: Increases the safety of hero's fleet while navigating in severe storms, effectiveness improves with the Navigator Skill Level. (Note: Prerequisite requires the hero to possess a large Galleon with good wave resistance or better models. A large Galleon requires the hero to have certain prestige to be eligible for purchase at a shipyard.)

—System Prompt: You have converted your innate talent to a professional specialty, now you have the opportunity to choose a new innate talent; you can select a skill from those you have mastered to become your new talent.

Catherine took out the sea chart, "Captain, we've reached the coastal waters of the Elf Kingdom Farolan. The nearest big port is Elorin, and once on shore, the first thing the Captain must do is go to the Alliance Sea Commerce Association to get an outbound trade permit, only with this permit will the trading houses do business with us. Initially, the trade permit is only level 1, and trading houses will sell us a maximum of 10 units of low-grade goods per day. Only by doing more business and gaining a good reputation can we upgrade the permit to buy more and higher-grade goods. However, this doesn't fully utilize our ship's transport capacity. So, we should take on the Chamber of Commerce's transport tasks; the more and farther we transport, the more credit we gain, rapidly increasing the trade permit level. Overall, Lord System Skills were quite a pain as they left few Skill Points for fighting. As a Lord, the focus was on having many troops and Vice Heroes; fighting personally was the lesser option.
