Base formula:

Base formula:

$(5 \text{ 5}) * 5 = 50$

Formula with all Enchantments:

$(2 * 5 \text{ 2 * 5}) * 2 * 5 = 200$

This meant Kyle's attacking power had quadrupled.

How many levels was that in terms of Realm?

But wait, didn't a level only increase the power by 2 to 2.2 times?

Shouldn't it be two levels?

Nope.
