Chapter 168: Personnel Recommendations

Everyone nodded, Cai Zhiyuan's plan wasn't difficult to understand.

If two people both had usage rights for this immunity ticket, with one actively using it and the other not being active, then the active one would gain more favors and actually seize control of this ticket.

In the end, the other person would also have to use it actively.

That definitely wasn't the original intention of establishing this plan.

So the decision of whether it could be used had to rest with only one person but veto power could be given to two people.

On one hand, everyone's contribution ratios to this ticket were different, and those who paid more should rightfully enjoy some advantages. On the other hand, even with veto power, they would be cautious when using it.

Because every veto was equivalent to offending some people but even so, veto power couldn't be given to too many people, two was already sufficient.

Soon, the plan of "one person uses, two people veto" received everyone's agreement.

Next was discussing the specific candidates for these three people.

Wang Yongxin spoke first, "For the person who manages usage rights, I recommend Fu Chen."

This surprised many people, including Fu Chen himself.

He was puzzled, "Brother Wang, you're recommending me? Why?"

Among the five-person group, many people thought Fu Chen was the most easily replaceable member, and Fu Chen himself was actually aware of this.

Initially, his passive inclusion in the group's core was largely due to coincidence. After several consecutive meetings, Fu Chen had actually exposed his shortcomings in political ability.

So now most proposal content was taken over by Li Renshu.

Regarding this situation, Fu Chen didn't feel he was being excluded. He felt that since Li Renshu did better, he could completely withdraw from this small circle but Li Renshu had always insisted, requiring him to stay.

Regardless, Fu Chen had already regarded himself as a marginal person, so Wang Yongxin's sudden proposal surprised him too.

Wang Yongxin explained, "Because you're the person in the community with the most compassion, empathy, and spirit of sacrifice, and would be more willing to use this immunity ticket for others."

Obviously, Wang Yongxin hadn't said everything.

Lin Sizhi could easily understand why Wang Yongxin wanted to recommend Fu Chen.

Usage rights for this ticket could be said to be the greatest power in the entire community currently, because it meant not only usage, but also "stronger veto power."

When situations occurred, if the person controlling immunity ticket usage rights decided not to use it, that was equivalent to direct veto.

If the immunity ticket's total power was 100%, then the two veto powers would each account for at most 20%, with the remaining 60% in the hands of whoever controlled usage rights.

Of course, the biggest obstacle to this plan still came from the five-person group itself, especially whether Li Renshu and Cai Zhiyuan were willing to hand this power to Fu Chen.

Cai Zhiyuan didn't speak, seemingly still thinking.

Li Renshu nodded slightly, "Hmm, giving it to Fu Chen is also a good plan for me."

Just then, Qin Yao weakly raised her hand, "Eh, shouldn't giving it to Lawyer Lin be most reasonable?"

"The stronger someone is, the more they can take responsibility for the consequences of 'using this ticket,' right?"

This viewpoint also gained quite a bit of agreement.

Suppose a weak person decided to use this ticket to save another weak person, then in the following month, if a strong person failed in a game, the weak person couldn't bear that responsibility.
