72 An Urgent Call

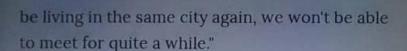

Clark's mansion.

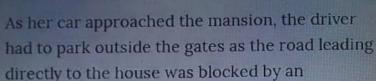
She excused herself which greatly upset Liam but he let her answer it nonetheless, especially since Austin was already back to nag him as well.
