As time passed, more and more examinees entered the room. By the final ten minutes before the exam, almost every seat had been occupied.

At the podium stood a woman who appeared to be in her early twenties, writing the exam time “8:00~9:30” on the blackboard. She was the invigilator for this exam.

Terrance was somewhat surprised. He hadn’t expected a Joy to be the invigilator, as she was from the same family as Little June. However, the Joy family was widespread, so there might not necessarily be any connection between them.

Using the last ten minutes, Bell Joy quieted down the classroom and explained the exam rules in detail.

Compared to other traits, this particular aspect stands out significantly. To answer the first question correctly, one must not only have a comprehensive understanding of Poochyena but also be able to distinguish the primary and secondary aspects of their temperament and traits.

The second question [with an illustration]: What is Gyarados' secondary type?

A) Water, B) Dragon, C) Dark, D) Flying

Terrance swiftly answered the multiple-choice questions without any pause.

Meanwhile, Bell Joy, who was responsible for supervising the exam, surveyed the surroundings. After seeing Terrance and June's information, she was also greatly surprised. Ten-year-old examinees, and it seemed that one of them was from the same family as her. It was truly remarkable.

So, she decided to pay more attention to these two young examinees' results after the exam.

Meanwhile, Terrance immediately shifted his focus to the fill in the blanks questions. If the multiple-choice questions could be guessed correctly, the fill in the blanks questions would put one's knowledge base to the test.

The first question: Beldum primarily relies on (——) to control its movements.

At first glance, this might be considered a very simple question. Some might feel lucky and confidently write down “Take Down” or “Psychic Power.” However, generally, such surface-level answers tend to be incomplete or incorrect.

Beldum’s body is magnetized, and it uses magnetic force to move, communicate, and control its attacks. It is said to have a connection with Magnemite, but Beldum’s magnetic force primarily focuses on Psychic-type moves rather than Steel-type moves. In battle, Beldum’s capabilities are quite limited, as it can only use Take Down when not taught any other moves.

Perhaps some have seen the rare Beldum and observed their fighting style closely, then it is not difficult to notice that they only use the move “Take Down.” So naturally, some might confidently fill in “Take Down” for this question.

Another approach would be to consider Beldum’s types, Steel and Psychic. Steel-type is difficult to explain, but Psychic, on the other hand, is naturally associated with the basic means of controlling their own movements.

Therefore, very few people can answer “magnetic force” correctly. These questions are designed to weed out examinees who are trying to take advantage of uncertainty.

After writing the word “magnetic force,” Terrance continued with the questions.

One, two, three... Terrance's accumulated knowledge from his daily efforts effortlessly manifested during the exam. He answered swiftly and with ease.
